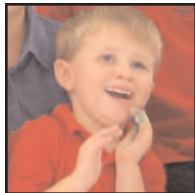

Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd

The kindergarten children have been learning about vibration, plants and the weather and are refining their math, Chinese and English reading, writing and spelling skills. The first grade children are enjoying Spanish projects, multiplication and Algebra, learning about microorganisms and honing their Chinese and English language skills. They are happy to tell you about the first ten US Presidents.

The second grades students are studying the Revolutionary War, measurement tools, and multiplication, division and Algebra. They now have a Chinese vocabulary of about 800 words and are learning to write poems in Spanish.



Pre-K3 and Pre-K4

The preschool children have adjusted well to the new environment. In Pre-K3, the kids have an art project each day. In Chinese, they are learning common commands and phrases and about animals, colors and family members. In English, they are learning the alphabet and how to count. The Pre-K4 students are reading and spelling simple English words. They have started science lessons and can understand most commands and hold simple conversations in Chinese. One child feels like he finally has something on his parents and holds Chinese "lessons" at every opportunity. Each day is a new adventure!



Moon Festival



On September 25 the Panama City Renaissance School celebrated the Moon Festival, the harvest festival in China (similar to Thanksgiving in the US). The children sampled traditional moon cake and sang Chinese songs for their parents. Then everyone ate Chinese food and socialized.
