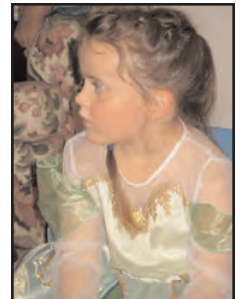
Campfire

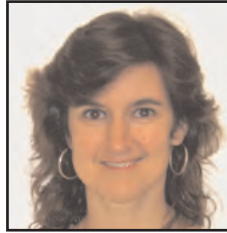

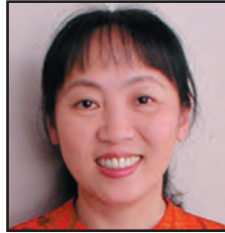

Kindergarten

Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd Grade

The kindergarten children have been learning all kinds of new things. In addition to learning how to read, code and write in English the children can also understand many words in Chinese. They also have started Singapore math. In first grade, the children are refining their English reading, spelling and writing skills and have started learning basic grammar and details about the US presidents. They are also learning multiplication in math, increasing their Chinese vocabulary and have started science lessons. The second graders are continuing to build their Chinese skills, are working on division, and are learning about water and heat in science. In the integrated English/History curriculum, the children are learning how to write essays and about US history before the American Revolution.

Artist in Residence

The PCRS is very fortunate to have Kim Griffin at the school this fall. Ms. Griffin, a commissioned artist for The Carter (former US President) Center, is holding a special eight lesson program for the kindergarten - 2nd grade children. The kids are learning about many aspects of art from shading to graphic design.



Engineer Teaches Science

In second grade, the children learn about water and wastewater. In addition to in-class details of how water gets to and from our houses, the kids had a hands on demonstration of the water purification process by David Kozan, Sr. Project Engineer with CDM.



Pre-K3 and Pre-K4

The preschool classrooms are always fun to visit. In addition to adjusting to the classroom environment, the kids have learned many Chinese words and phrases. They also have fun with arts and crafts and singing. In Pre-K4 English, the children are learning to identify letters and letter sounds and are practicing pencil holding and handwriting skills. In English, the Pre-K3 children are learning the alphabet and how to count. They have also started the process of learning how to hold the pencil.
